Students are trained under various activities recommended by NMC as per CBME curriculum.

In Poonamallee RHTC, students are trained in NCD related activities, School health visits under RBSK programme and collection and reporting of vital statistics. In Soranchery RHTC, the focus is on Primary level of Health care by allowing Subcentre visits and also visit to Anganwadi centres. In Kollumedu RHTC the thrust area is on environment wherein the students are trained in Vector Borne disease control activities, Exposure to Safe water supply and basic sanitation activities.

In the Urban Health Training Centre, MCH related learning activities are focussed which includes training on family planning methods and immunization sessions.

In addition to these activities, students are also trained in Family Adoption Programme mandated by NMC. Students will be trained in General and Health survey in Phase I and will be taught to provide individualised health education after identifying specific disease/ill health.

Nutritional status assessment will be covered in Phase II and will be trained to comprehend the inter-play between various factors like socioeconomic status and nutritional status in the causation of diseases. In Phase III, the focus will be shifted to Environmental assessment and they will be actively involved in healthcare delivery as the first contact physician.
